Workshop 1

‘CLIL principles, pedagogy and practice for university teachers’

This highly informed and yet practical workshop is comprised of two sessions. In the second session, a demo lesson from my historical linguistics course will be conducted so participants can experience as students how CLIL works in the tertiary lecture room.
